REPORTS OF INTERNATIONAL GUESTS

International President Kinsey Robinson remarked that the economy is still weak but expected to pick up slowly. Some of our areas are weak, like Florida and Texas. The trusteeships of Locals 8 and 154 have been extremely successful. Local 190 in Alaska is going through changes, and Local 71 and Local 134 are out of supervision.
