Minutes of the Northwest District Council

The meeting of the Northwest District Council of Roofers was held in Portland, OR, on September 23-24, 2011. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 23.

OFFICERS AND DELEGATES IN ATTENDANCE:

Credentials for Steve Hurley and Gregg Gibeau as delegates from Seattle Local 54 were read. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the minutes as read.

REPORTS OF DELEGATES AND GUESTS

Russ Garnett, Local 49, on April 1 was appointed to the position of business manager until elections in July. He then was nominated, won the election and will serve out the remaining term until July 2012.

Local 49 signed a new two-year agreement with an increase each year until July 2013. Work has improved, with all 550 members working. The apprenticeship program is doing well, with 205 apprentices registered. Ninety were indentured this year. The local will graduate 21 to journey level. There are currently 14 women in the program and six journeymen. In the coming year Local 49 hopes to expand in their local job market.

Steve Hurley, Local 54, said work is very slow. The non-union is pounding at every door to take what work is available. Hours are down almost 10%

from last year.

The Deep Bore tunnel will have major waterproofing at the cut and cover entrances and exits. The cut and cover waterproofing will be hot rubberized asphalt, which is primarily done by signatory contractors.

Local 54 is developing a marketing strategy and negotiating points to talk with signatories about. The contract ends next May.

Leo Marsura, Local 189, said hours have been down this year, but third quarter is looking better. They may work later into the year on big projects like a Fred Meyer store, Gonzaga University and Bonneville Power Administration.

Local 189 collected a settlement from Cobra Roofing for misclassification of workers on two jobs. State Labor & Industries is investigating them on a Port of Pasco job.

Local 189 is supporting incumbent Mayor Mary Verner in the election this year. She has helped the Building Trades get an important contractor ordinance law passed for city work.
