NMAPC Zero Injury Safety Awards Dinner

The National Maintenance Agreement Policy Committee (NMAPC) Inc. held its annual Zero Injury Safety Awards (ZISA) dinner on October 25, 2007, at the historic National Building Museum in Washington, DC. Labor Co-chairman Robert J. Krul of the Roofers International Union and Management Co-chairman Robert C. Hoover of Aker Kvaerner Songer were co-presenters of the awards.

2006 was a record year for safety under the NMAPC program. With 62 winners, it marked the largest number of honorees ever. These contractors, owners, and craft representatives were recognized for performing a combined 9,810,227 injury-free work hours under the NMAPC program.

The Gold Star Zero Injury Plaque was awarded to Superior Construction Company, Inc. of the Northwestern Indiana Building Trades Council for 1,329,000 safe work hours at the Whiting Refinery in Whiting, IN, for BP Products North America, Inc.

The ZISA program is highlighted by a dinner where the awards are given out and the participants in the NMAPC program are recognized for their dedication to safe job sites. Attendees were privileged to hear Brother Cecil Roberts Jr., President of the United Mine Workers, as the keynote speaker.
