2012 International Roofing Expo Hits Orlando

he 2012 International Roofing Expo ran Feb. 22–24 at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando, FL. For the second year in a row there was an increase in attendance—a good sign for the industry overall.

This year's Expo drew over 8,300 attendees from all 50 states and ten foreign countries. Participants came from all segments of the roofing industry, including commercial and residential contractors, builders, remodelers, building owners, facility managers, manufacturers, architects, engineers and other ancillary industry professionals.

The show floor also saw an increase with 932 booths, a 6% increase over last year's exhibit. The United Union of

Roofers, Waterproofers & Allied Workers sponsored a booth which proved to be a great draw among the mix of new and established exhibitors.

The national expo always provides cutting-edge programs. Highlights included workshops on recycling roofing materials and advanced green technologies. This year also marked the debut of Live Demo Safety Day: Live demonstrations took place on the show floor focusing on jobsite safety and the use of innovative tools while on the job. The products and information available at this year's International Roofing Expo made it one of the most successful shows yet.
