The response from our local unions, members and contractors regarding the foreman training surveys we sent out has been nothing short of phenomenal. To date, we have received over 350 completed surveys from current foremen, former foremen and contractors. The information gleaned from these surveys will assist our curriculum program developer, Dr. Eric Rice, with compiling a curriculum that is both comprehensive and meaningful for foreman training.

We wish to thank all of you who participated in filling out and returning the surveys to us. Your input is invaluable to Dr. Rice for without the collective wisdom and experience of those of you who are or were foremen, and the contractors who utilize foremen, we could not develop a first class foreman training program.

Appenticeship Competition

The first apprenticeship competition for the North Central States, Illinois, Michigan and Indiana combined district councils was conducted on April 29, 2006 at the Local 11 Apprenticeship Training facility in Indian Head Park, Illinois. Forty-eight apprentices from Locals 2, 11, 20, 23, 42, 65, 69, 96, 119 and 149 participated in the competition.

The original apprenticeship competition idea was generated by the Mid-States/Northeast District Councils, and they have been successfully conducting them for the last thirteen years. This was Local 11's first attempt at hosting the competition and it was a resounding success.

These competitions give our apprentices a chance to showcase their skills and abilities, while at the same time meeting their peers and brothers and sisters from local unions in their councils.
