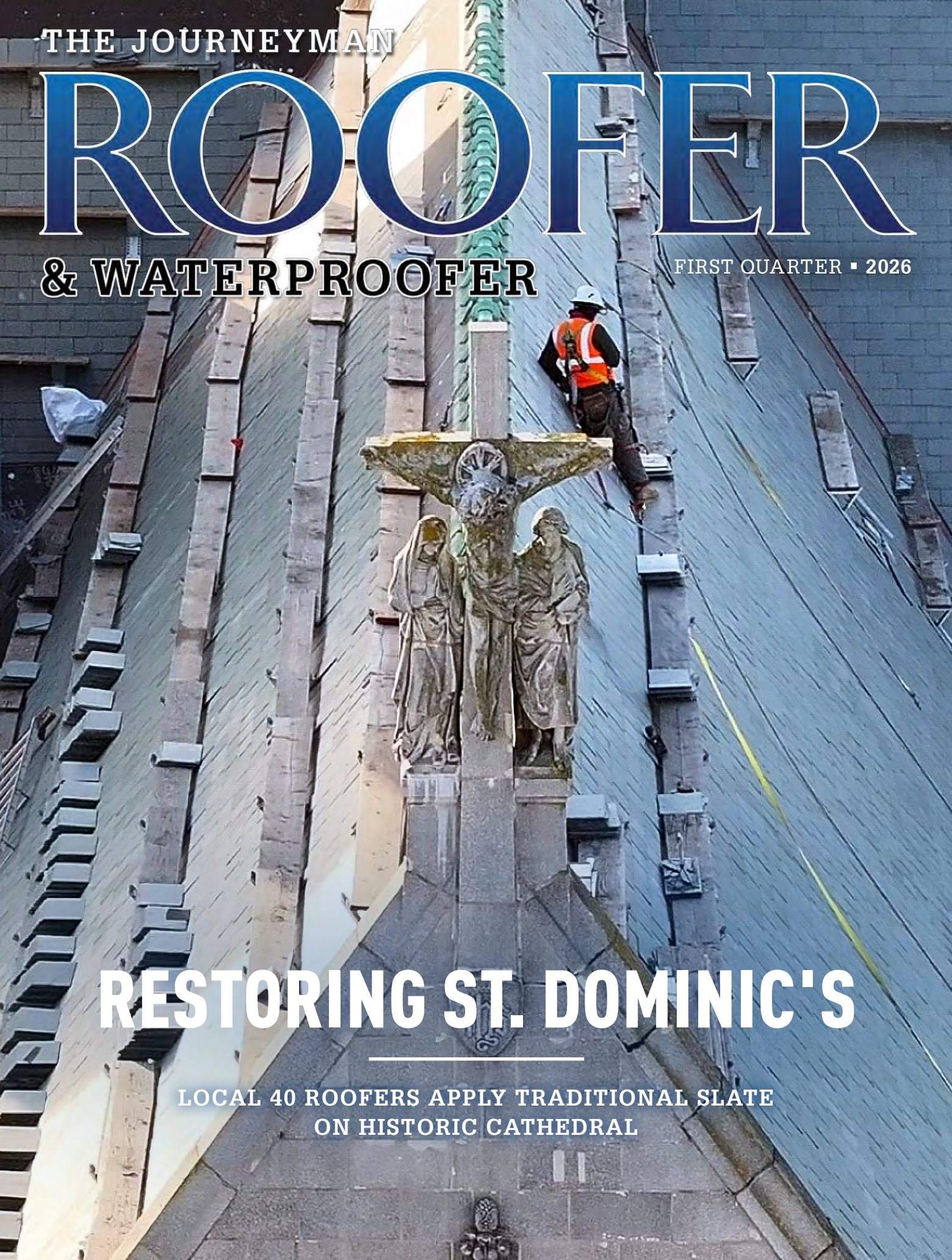

Are You Maximizing Your Union Benefits?

As we start the new year, I have exciting news regarding a new benefit for our members. Our union is establishing a scholarship program—the United Union of Roofers, Waterproofers and Allied Workers Scholarship Program—to enrich the value of membership, because we understand how difficult it can be for members to cover the sky-rocketing costs of higher education for their dependent children or spouse. Specific details regarding this new benefit, including the rules and application link, can be found on page 4.

We are excited to offer this benefit to our members in addition to the new Franklin University U-Learn Scholarship described on page 5, as well as the long-standing Union Plus Scholarship Award.

Speaking of education, over the past several years our union and the Research and Education Trust have invested significant resources in training our apprenticeship coordinators and instructors through the National Instructor Training Program (NITP) and our local union leadership through the Leadership Training Program (LTP). These programs, held at Washtenaw Community College, increase our ability to be successful instructors and effective local union leaders. We emphasize education for a reason: our members deserve

representation from knowledgeable and professional leaders.

However, it does not end there. It is important to educate the membership on understanding their rights, responsibilities, and duties as a member. Members in good standing have access to several benefits negotiated through the union. The Union Plus program, Union

In the case of your health insurance benefits, the same holds true. Understanding your plan allows you to maximize the utilization of the benefit. This is very important for our members, especially those with families.

The International Union, the National Roofing Industry Pension Funds (NRIPF), and the National

Understanding, for example, how you vest in your pension plan(s) and how hours worked affects the amount of your pension benefit—these things can help you better prepare for retirement.

Roofers Union & Employers Joint Health & Welfare Fund continue to publish information on benefits through our magazine and website on a regular basis for this reason—to educate the membership on the value of these benefits.

It is up to you to take the time and effort to be a knowledgeable member. As a member, do not hesitate to ask your leadership or local trust fund office for information on all of the benefits and programs they have to offer. In doing so, I believe you will have a stronger appreciation for your union membership. ■

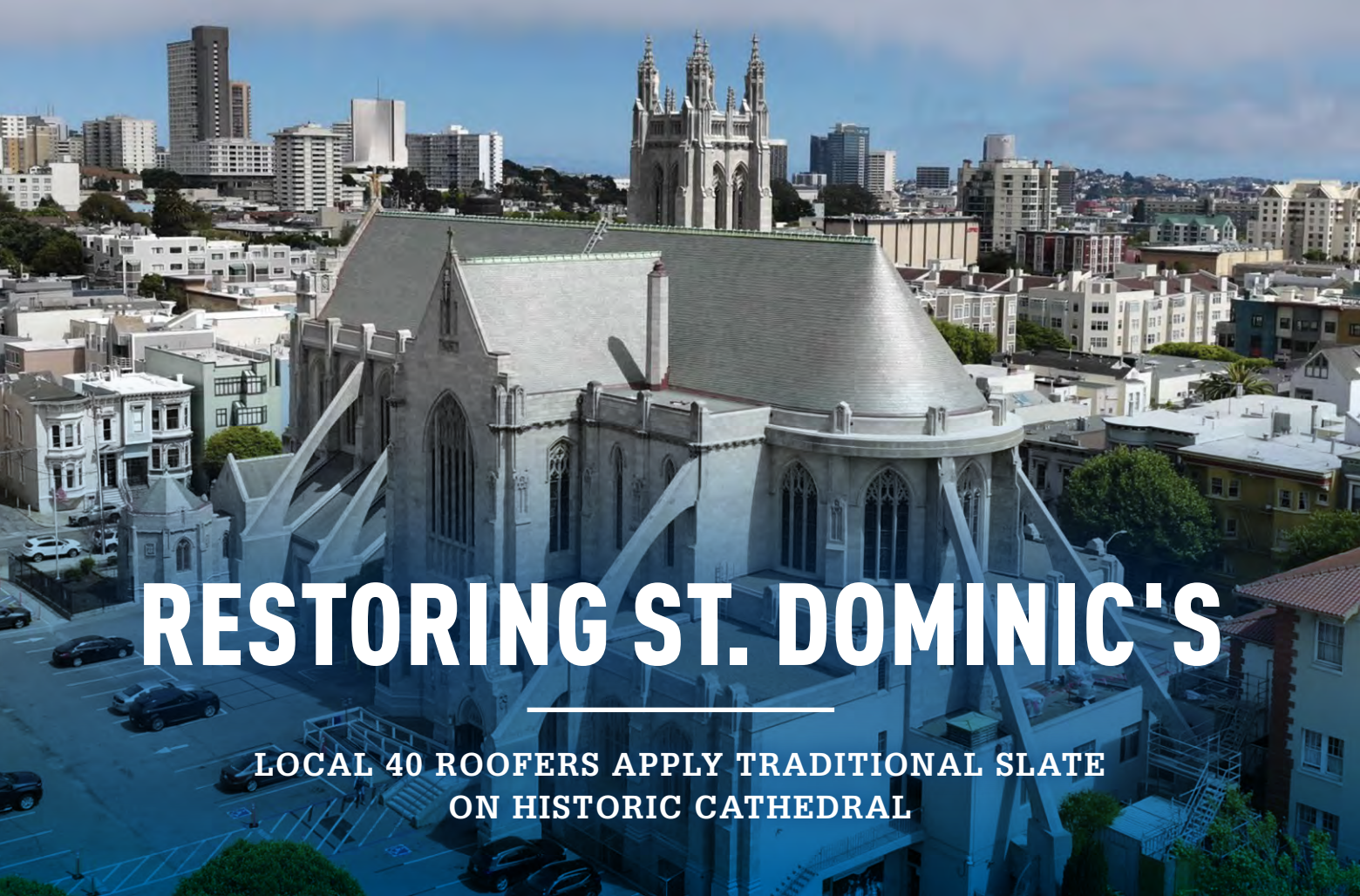

RESTORING ST. DOMINIC'S

LOCAL 40 ROOFERS APPLY TRADITIONAL SLATE ON HISTORIC CATHEDRAL

St. Dominic's Catholic Church in San Francisco is a beloved institution with a difficult past. The Gothic-style structure, completed in 1928, was built in the shape of a cross and covered in traditional slate roofing. Over the decades it has endured earthquake damage and multiple restoration projects—the most recent being a roof renovation.

This exceptional project presented challenges in its detail, slope and scale, but the talented members of Roofers and Waterproofers

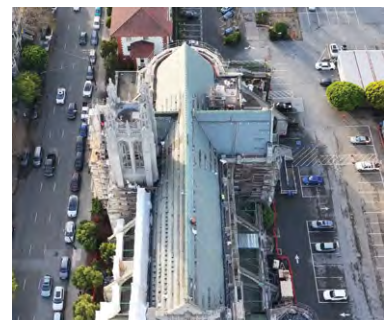
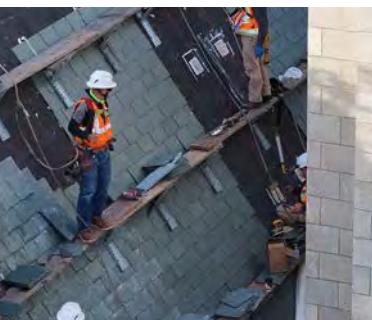
Local 40, San Francisco, CA, had the knowledge and training necessary to nail it.

Lawson Roofing, the oldest union-signatory roofing contractor in the Bay Area, completed this restoration using skilled Local 40 members, applying traditional slate by hand. It's a beautiful example of old-world craftsmanship done by modern union hands.

Foreman Jose Bautista led this complex project, bringing deep expertise in slate work to navigate

its steep slopes and elevated heights. Jose Cruz, Alexander Moncada, Rafael Bello, Sergio Castanon, and Manuel Cruz were a few of the talented members on site.

“Longstanding institutions like the Catholic Archdiocese choose us and our contractors because of the consistent quality and integrity of our work,” said Local 40 Business Manager Peter Lang. That trust has been built over generations, and this project is a shining example of that partnership in action. ■





Roofers and Contractors Converge at Industry Trade Shows

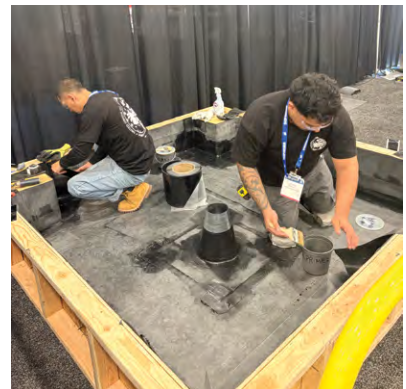

Franklin University, in partnership with Employee Benefit Systems Inc., is proud to announce a new partnership with the Roofers and Waterproofers Union to offer a U-Learn scholarship, creating a tuition-free education for a union member or family member to complete an associate or bachelor's degree at Franklin University.

Roofers U-Learn Scholarship

One candidate will be selected each year to receive a full undergraduate scholarship to complete an associate or bachelor's degree. This scholarship is open to union and family members who submit a completed application by June 1, 2026. The winner will be selected and notified by June 19, 2026.

College credit for Roofers Apprenticeships

Members of the roofing and waterproofing trades bring exceptional technical skill, safety expertise, and disciplined on-the-job learning to their work every day. Recognizing this, Franklin University recently completed a comprehensive review of the Roofers & Waterproofers National Apprenticeship Guideline Standards, confirming that

completers of the full U.S. Department of Labor-registered apprenticeship are eligible to receive 36 semester hours of technical credit upon enrollment at Franklin.

Apprenticeship graduates who enroll at Franklin can apply:

- 27 technical credits towards the A.A.S. in Business Administration, with 33 credits remaining
- An additional 9 technical credits, for a total of 69 applied credits, towards the B.S. in Applied Management, with 55 credits remaining

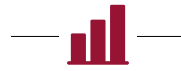

Women in Roofing & Waterproofing

Tiara Jones, a Force out of Baltimore

Tiara Jones has been a member of our trade since 2018, and being a roofer has taught her how to read a jobsite, the same way some people read faces. She knows when a deck is solid, when a seam will fail if rushed after being welded, and when a storm is coming hours before the clouds roll in.

Her boots move with purpose across the surface, tool belt swinging, hands already busy as she checks measurements and marked lines. She is a union roofer in Baltimore Local 30, and that means a lot to her.

When Tiara first stepped onto a roof, the noise alone nearly sent her back down the ladder. The torches roared, compressors screamed, and every mistake felt like it cost her pride. Some people doubted her before she ever touched a tool. She remembers the looks, the silence, the way conversations stopped when she walked up.

What kept her there on the job was grit, and the day-to-day responsibility of being an adult paying the bills. Tiara, however, is blessed to have a business agent named Ernest Washington.

Ernest is the kind of business agent who doesn't chase attention. He has a calm, steady presence and a voice that carries weight, because he never has to raise it. He saw Tiara struggling early on—not with her work, but

with being seen. One afternoon, after a long day, he pulled her aside. "You belong here," he told her plainly. "But belonging isn't enough. You've got to own it."

From then on, Ernest became her mentor. He taught her about how contracts work and explained the politics of the union hall. He made sure she understood her rights—and her responsibilities. When jobs slowed

down or frustrations ran high, he reminded her that the union hall wasn't just about today's paycheck. It was about building a future. And that if she ever wanted extra skill practice, the apprentice hall was always open to her.

Now, nearly a decade later, Tiara carries those lessons with her onto every job, whether new construction or a tear-off. She has consistently worked for Kalkreuth Roofing, a longstanding, family-owned contractor in Frederick, Maryland. One where expectations are high and mistakes are expensive. This company does not hand out respect; respect is earned. Tiara has earned hers the hard way.

She continues to show up, and she corrects any mistakes with humility and grace. She understands that her job is not an easy one, but she is thankful that she has a mentor who believes in her, which makes things a little easier.

Tiara thinks a lot about her future. Steward, foreman, superintendent. Maybe even sitting at the table one day, advocating for workers the way Ernest advocated for her. Tomorrow will always bring another roof, another challenge, another chance to prove once again that she belongs there too.

Local 30, which is run by International Vice President/Business Manager Shawn McCullough, has an area which is comprised of Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington, DC, and Northern Virginia. Local 30 is home to sixteen female members who work hard every day. Vice President McCullough is very happy with the growth of his local, and he hopes it will continue to attract female workers. ■

Associate Degree Opportunities Through Apprenticeship

The Roofers & Waterproofers Research and Education Joint Trust Fund has successfully completed two associate degree articulation agreements with Washtenaw Community College in Ann Arbor, MI. These agreements are for instructors who participate at our National Instructor Training Program and/or for any members who have completed a registered apprenticeship program with one of their home locals.

The two degree programs are an Associate in Applied Science

— Industrial Training (for those who are pursuing completion at our National Instructor Training Program) and an Associate in Applied Science — Construction Supervision (for members who have completed an apprenticeship with the United Union of Roofers, Waterproofers and Allied Workers).

These articulation agreements allow a member to transfer 26 credits towards either one of the associate degree programs upon successful completion of their apprenticeship. All of Washtenaw

Community College's required General Education and Construction Supervision courses are available online.

Washtenaw Community College has been the partner and home of the National Instructor Training Program (NITP) and Leadership Training Program (LTP) since 2019.

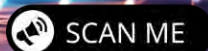

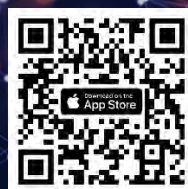

CONSTRUCTION SUPERVISION COURSES

Classes are limited to active members of articulated union - skilled trade programs.

UAS 111 - Motivating Employees

This course provides an introduction to the study of organizational behavior and motivational theory for students enrolled in the Construction Supervision certificate and associate degree programs. The importance of understanding how motivation, personality, conflict, communication, group dynamics, and leadership are important in supervising the construction project is highlighted.



UAS 122 - Supervisory Skills

This course is an introduction to construction project management. From the configuration of the project team through the project closeout, students will identify the supervisory skills needed for a successful construction project.

UAS 210 - Legal/Personnel Issues

This course is one of the series of courses for students enrolled in the Construction Supervision certificate and associate degree programs. This course introduces students to contract law, labor agreements and other legal relationships as they apply to the construction industry. Students will examine issues related to managing human resources such as recruiting, pay incentives, evaluations and training. Various aspects of career management will be highlighted.

UAS 222 - Construction Project

In this course, students examine stakeholders of the construction project and their relationship to each other. Students will become familiar with the basic function of a construction project and how the activities performed contribute to the overall profitability and health of a project as a whole. In addition, students will gain practical and operational supervisory skills specifically in the areas of planning, organizing and leading construction projects.

UAS 230 - Scheduling and Project Management

In this course, students are introduced to the various processes used to develop and manage the schedule of a project. Additionally, students will examine various tools used to assist in schedule development and management. Finally, students will explore the desktop scheduling software Microsoft Project. Washtenaw Community

Washtenaw Community College has hosted the Roofer Instructor Training Program on its Ann Arbor, Michigan campus for the past seven years.

The college provides quality, accessible education to approximately 22,000 credit and 8,000 non-credit students each year.

WCC's 45+ online degree and certificate programs are designed to help students meet their academic and career goals. Online learners need to be independent, motivated self-starters. Because classes are available 24/7, students have the flexibility of scheduling class and study time during different hours than work or family time. Attend class anywhere you have a computer with access to high-speed internet.

Roofers Instructors Complete OSHA 502

The Roofers & Waterproofers Research and Education Trust Fund presented an OSHA 502 course at Washtenaw Community College in Ann Arbor, MI, on December 9-11, 2025. This OSHA 502 course was instructed by Master Trainers Richard Tessier, James Currie and Joel Gonzalez.

This course is designed for trainers who have previously completed an OSHA 500 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for the Construction Industry and are authorized trainers in the OSHA Outreach Training Program.

The course provides an update on OSHA Construction Standards, policies, and regulations. Upon course completion students will have the ability to demonstrate continued professional development in their field by applying effective adult learning principles and interactive

training techniques to clearly identify, define, and explain construction industry hazards and acceptable corrective measures as they continue to teach the 10- and 30-hour Construction Outreach Training Program classes.

PROTECT YOUR SKIN!

1 Prevent exposure

Try not to get your arms or clothes wet. Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) such as gloves, coveralls, and boots. If you work outdoors, always put on sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher. Make sure your hands and skin are clean before applying sunscreen.

2 Wear gloves

Use the right gloves for the materials, tasks, and chemicals. Wear gloves that fit and keep the inside of your gloves clean and dry.



- ▶ **WASH** and dry your hands before putting on gloves.
- ▶ **CLEAN** off the outside of your gloves before taking them off.
- ▶ **DO NOT TOUCH** the outside of your gloves when you take them off.
- ▶ **DISCARD** gloves with holes, tears, or worn areas.

3 Keep skin clean

Wash with soap and clean water if your skin comes in contact with hazardous materials and after removing your gloves. Use a pH neutral soap if you work with caustics like wet cement.



Using a hand washing station

- ▶ **DO NOT** wash your hands with the water in the bucket used to clean your tools.
- ▶ **DO NOT** use hand sanitizers.

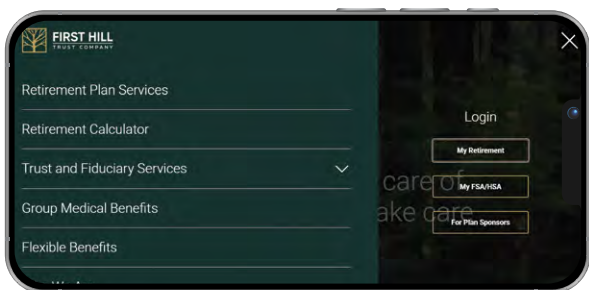

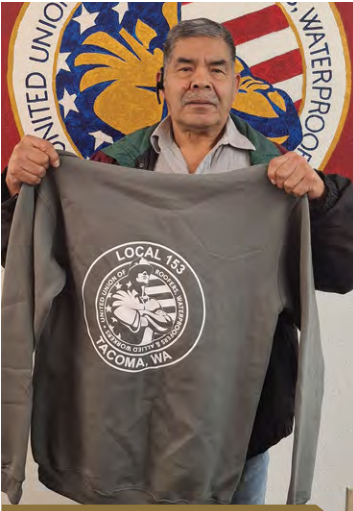

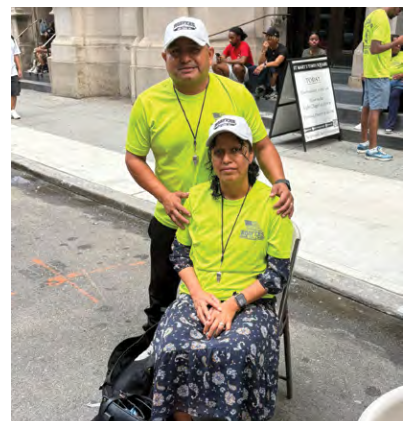

I'd like to remind all locals to contact your international representative 60 to 45 days prior to nomination meetings to review procedures and mailings prior to being sent out. Multiple locals have had issues with elections and have had to do them over, which is a costly burden on the local.

Locals in the national health and welfare plan should expect a \$0.20 increase per hour—keep this in mind when negotiating upcoming contracts. All locals are encouraged to request contributions from employers and members for their apprenticeship programs. We need to keep these programs healthy and well-funded as training is key to our success.

It is time once again for local union reviews. I will be scheduling a time to come into Locals 49, 54, 91, 153, 189, and 200 to review issues such as backup plans for user IDs and passwords and receipt retention. Remember to write who, what, where, and purpose on the back of the itemized receipt and make sure all spending is approved through the executive board and membership.

Local 54, Seattle, WA, hired a new apprenticeship trainer, Richard Kerns. He has 27 years' roofing experience and an additional four years of sheet metal experience. Soon he will take over as training coordinator.

Local 49, Portland, OR, and Local 189, Yakima, WA, area are entering contract negotiations. Local 54, Seattle, WA, and Local 58, Colorado Springs, CO, are both in an election year and contract negotiations will be starting

soon. If there are any changes to the language in your CBA, please reach out to me for prior approval.

Local 58 Business Manager Ray Gallegos signed a one-job agreement with Pitch Roofing and Exteriors for a project in the Grand Junction area. In the last three months the local has dispatched 23 new initiates to contractors in need of help. In Salt Lake City, UT, I met with the building trades organizers committee. They have multiple projects that we will be working on together and one large PLA pending.

Thanks to Local 153, Tacoma, WA, Business Manager Richard Geyer for inviting me to the general meeting and pin ceremony; it was an outstanding event. Richard has formed a political committee with Locals 54, 153, and 189, combining all the locals in Washington to have a stronger voice at the legislative level. Rachael Geyer of the Pierce County Roofers JATC also brought together training coordinators from the Washington locals to object to WTI seeking RSI reciprocity into Washington State out of Ohio. WTI withdrew their request. ■



Report of International Vice President **Brent Beasley**

I began the month by attending the LA/OC Building Trades Council Executive Board meeting, where current regional labor priorities, legislative updates, and ongoing construction industry matters were reviewed with affiliated trade representatives. I then attended the Local 81, Oakland, CA, executive board meeting and conferred with acting Business Manager Morgan Nolte regarding administrative continuity and immediate organizational needs. Unlawful Harassment in Apprenticeship and the Workplace

At our Thirtieth Convention, Resolution 31 regarding harassment, discrimination and bullying in the workplace was adopted by the delegates present. Thereafter, an email from our International President, James Hadel, was sent to all local unions regarding the adopted resolution, along with the policy. The resolution requires each subordinate local union to read the adopted policy statement at least once yearly at a monthly meeting of its choosing. In part, the policy reads:

“This Union does not discriminate against or allow any action to be taken against any individual based on their race, ethnicity, religion, color, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, disability, gender identity or expression, ancestry, pregnancy, or any other basis prohibited by law, or based on the employee’s protected activity under the anti-discrimination statutes.

This Union emphatically reaffirms that it will not tolerate bullying, discrimination, or harassment in any form. This prohibition covers any activity in the workplace, regardless of whether the bullying, discrimination, or harassment is committed by a union officer, union member, union employee, or nonemployees such as a vendor, consultant, or employee or officer of an affiliate, or invitee to a Union-sponsored activity, event or meeting.”

As members of the United Union of Roofers and Waterproofers, it’s essential that we all come together to adapt to the evolving expectations of today’s workplace. Anti-harassment training is a fundamental part of creating a respectful and inclusive work environment for everyone. By attending and actively putting this training into practice, we can foster a diverse and harmonious workforce where all members feel safe and valued.

Standards of Conduct for Officers, Members, and Employers

The harassment policy expands upon the responsibilities put forth in our Union’s two standing codes of conduct: the **Statement of Personal and Professional Standards of Conduct** for officers, and the **Professional Code of Conduct and Standards of Mutual Responsibility** for local unions, members, and employers.

The former is a set of guidelines that all officers and executive board members are required to follow to exercise the highest ethical standards of conduct and practice fundamental honesty at all times. Officers are expected to not deceive or defraud others, misrepresent the union, use union resources for personal benefit,

or accept anything of value from industry employers, among other things.

The Professional Code of Conduct outlines responsibilities for members, employers, and local unions to ensure productive, safe worksites and projects completed on time, under budget, and built right the first time. It emphasizes teamwork and professionalism on the jobsite at all times. ■

Now enjoying retirement for 28 fulfilling years, he continues to cherish time with Cooky, his wife of over 65 years. Their family has blossomed beautifully, boasting two wonderful daughters, three grandchildren, and several great-grandchildren.

His retirement years have been enriched by his passions of fishing and traveling. Yet what truly defines his lifelong journey is his unwavering belief in union values. To Brother Bergman, the union has been a steadfast defender of worker dignity, providing critical support against unfair practices while protecting wages, pensions, and healthcare. He remains an inspiring testament to the strength, resilience, and enduring pride that embodies the true spirit of union membership. ■
